September 28, 2007

The regular meeting of the College Facilities Master Plan Council was held on Friday, September 28, 2007, at 2:00 pm, in Room F106.

Vice President Satele opened the meeting with a PowerPoint presentation on Campus Signage. The college signage history was reviewed.

PowerPoint on Campus Signage

- 2001 The original concepts were developed.
- 2005 GCCCD interviewed signage designers. Selection was made for Harmon Nelson.
- 2006 The College Facilities Master Plan Council Ad Hoc Committee was created.
- 2007 Governing Board gave permission to award; advertise bid package; and approve shop drawings. Manufacturing began, and in December 2007 the new signage will be installed.

There was some discussion about monument signage, but we will have to wait for more funding to take on that project. The Signage Workgroup met this week. Installation will begin in the last week of November 2007. Copies of all of the proposed numbering/lettering were distributed to all members of the committee with a request to proofread the numbering and lettering for their building for accuracy before the next meeting. There will be a Schedule Kickoff/Open House tentatively scheduled for Wednesday, November 14, 2007 from 5:00 – 8:00pm. At that time there will be an unveiling of the new room numbering. All Signage is ADA compliant with Braille lettering/numbering.

There was discussion about smoking areas on campus. We may need to move the smoking area next to the Student Center, and use the concrete tables from LRC for smoking areas.
