

CAUTIONS AND CONCERNS

1. STATE-WIDE CCC SYSTEM OUTLOOK

- 2012 Proposition 30 is temporary
 - Sales tax increase terminates 2016
 - Income tax increase terminates 2018
- STRS Obligations underfunded
 - No source of funds yet identified
 - At 19.1%, effective cost increase is over \$300 million
- Deficits
 - Budget shortfalls continue to concern Sacramento (and El Cajon!)



CAUTIONS AND CONCERNS (CONT'D)

2. CUYAMACA COLLEGE OUTLOOK

- Fully funding part-time faculty costs
- Manage hourly costs better
- Costs for utilities, operations, step and column, and employee benefits continue to rise
- FTES generation is essential
- Increasing student success is absolute
- College and District unities must prevail

COMMENDATIONS

The College:

- Improving communication, and engaging the classified staff, throughout the participatory governance process
- Fostering a culture of students first
- Maintaining beautiful grounds and facilities
- Using data for SLO assessment in Student Services
- Engaging students in participatory governance
- Creating an environment of empowerment, evidenced by voluntary service of staff

RECOMMENDATION 6 CURRICULUM

In order to meet the Standards, the team recommends that the College implement an ongoing, systematic review process of course outlines to ensure currency and relevancy for all disciplines.

(Accreditation Standard II.A.2.e)

CURRICULUM ACTIONS

A Five-Year Curriculum Review Process was approved and implemented by the Curriculum Committee and endorsed by the Academic Senate prior to the ACCJC visit in fall 2013.

CURRICULUM ACTIONS (CONT'D)

Out of the currently active 727 course outlines, 188 were reviewed in 2012-13 and 306 in 2013-14 to ensure currency and relevancy for all disciplines.

CURRICULUM ACTIONS (CONT'D)

The Curriculum Committee expects to complete a review of all scheduled course outlines by the end of fall 2014.

CURRICULUM ACTIONS (CONT'D)

By the end of the 2014-15 academic year, 100% of the courses will be current with the five-year review cycle.

RECOMMENDATION 7 STAFFING PLAN

In order to meet the Standards, the team recommends that the College assess and analyze the level and diversity of its full-time faculty and staff.

It further recommends that the College use the results of that assessment to develop, adopt, fund, and implement long-range staffing and resource allocation plans that will ensure a sufficient number of qualified, diverse, full-time faculty and staff to foster the institution's mission and purposes, assure the integrity and quality of its programs, and maintain services to students.

(Accreditation Standards III.A.2, III.A.4.b, III.A.6, IV.B.3.c)

STAFFING PLAN ACTIONS

The colleges and the district developed a phased plan for correction of this deficiency:

Phase I:

Consultant was hired to conduct staffing analysis

Phase II:

Consultant will be hired to write a staffing plan

RECOMMENDATION 8 SLOS

In order to meet the Standards, the team recommends that the District and the College include, as a required component of the formal evaluations of faculty and others directly responsible for student progress toward achieving stated student-learning outcomes, a means to evaluate effectiveness in producing those outcomes.

(Accreditation Standard III.A.1.c)

SLOs ACTIONS

Executive administrator evaluations address effectiveness in producing student learning outcomes.

SLOS ACTIONS (CONT'D)

Deans are evaluated on their ability to "lead in ensuring the college meets ACCJC standards on student learning."

SLOS ACTIONS (CONT'D)

When conducting faculty evaluations, the Deans include comments relating to faculty members' participation in SLO Assessment.
