- · Organizational Health



Dr. Darla M. Cooper, Interim Executive Director, RP Group

Dr. Darla M. Cooper is an educational leader and expert in research and evaluation dedicated to using inquiry, data, and evidence to improve the lives of all community college students. As the Director of Research and Evaluation for the Research and Planning Group for the California Community Colleges (RP Group), she oversees all the research and evaluation projects for the organization. Dr. Cooper has worked in the California Community College system for almost 20 years, having previously held institutional research director positions at Santa Barbara City College, Oxnard College, and Ohlone College. She led Student Support (Re)defined, a research project that examined what supports student success, and has been invited to present on this work at various venues across the state. Dr. Cooper is currently serving as one of the coaches for the American Association of Community Colleges' (AACC) Pathways Project, and on the advisory committee for the California Guided Pathways Project. Dr. Cooper holds a BA in Psychology from the University of California, San Diego, and an MSEd and EdD from the University of Southern California.
