# **COLLEGE NOTEWORTHY NEWS**

#### • Senior High Math Field Day

The 44<sup>th</sup> Annual Senior High Math Field Day was recently held at Cuyamaca College. Teams from numerous local high schools involving over 90 students, coaches and volunteers, participated in a fun, rewarding, and challenging morning.

Competitive events included mathematics, computer programming and engineering. More than 30 medals were awarded to individual students and trophies were awarded to the top three schools at the end of the day's competition. Canyon Crest Academy High School was the proud recipient of the perpetual trophy that lists 32 years of winners, awarded to the school that ranks first place overall. Scripps Ranch High School placed second and La Jolla High School placed third.

Cuyamaca College, Grossmont College and Mesa College sponsored the events. Trophies and awards were made possible by the generous and continued funding and support of the Greater San Diego Math Council and the California Mathematics League. In addition, thanks go out to Texas Instruments, who provided electronic prizes for the events. The math department at Cuyamaca College looks forward to sponsoring this event again next year on Saturday, March 8, 2008, and coordinators Eric Preibisius and Tammi Marshall hope to involve even more of the area high schools.

#### New Record for Nursery Sales for OH Department

Thanks in part to the ongoing grant support of the Rice Family Foundation and the Morgan Rice Internship Program, Cuyamaca College's Ornamental Horticulture Department's nursery sales had an unprecedented 4<sup>th</sup> quarter and helped set a new record for annual sales with a total for the year of \$58,806.

The Rice Family Foundation provides support to the Ornamental Horticulture Department to help integrate classroom training with practical work experiences, and to increase the OH Department's contact with industry and the community. The Morgan Rice Internship Program provides financial support to six (6) interns.

#### • Ornamental Horticulture Program Receives Donated Truck

On Friday, March 23<sup>rd</sup> John Mohns, President of Benchmark Landscape, presented the Cuyamaca College Ornamental Horticulture Program with a 2000 Ford F350 stake bed truck having an estimated value of \$7,500 to support the operations of the Cuyamaca Collage Ornamental Horticulture Program.

The donation is the result of Brad Monroe, Ornamental Horticulture Program Coordinator, asking Mr. Mohns if he thought anyone in the industry might be interested in donating a used truck to the program. Mr. Monroe explained that the program had never had a truck but often needed one to support the lab activity classes. Without hesitation, Craig Mohns said he thought the company might be able to help and within a week, his brother, John Mohns, President of Benchmark Landscape, called to say they would like to make the donation. John Mohns and his brother, Craig Mohns, Vice President of Benchmark Landscaping, have been longtime supporters of the Ornamental Horticulture Program and were recently featured in an article in *Landscape Contractor Magazine* which told of their success in the growing the business over the past 22 years.
