# CUYAMACA COLLEGE'S AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY AND ORNAMENTAL HORTICULTURE PROGRAMS FEATURED ON LOCAL NEWS

Cuyamaca College's Automotive Technology and Ornamental Horticulture Programs were featured on KUSI Channel 9 News on August 8<sup>th</sup>. KUSI's Rod Luck interviewed Brad Monroe, President Perri, Jim Custeau and students of the two programs. Rod's story stressed the benefits of the strong industry ties that the Automotive Technology program has with local dealerships and the opportunities for students to get immediate employment upon graduation. His component on the OH program featured the college nursery and the seven programs students can major in relating to Ornamental Horticulture. He further stressed Cuyamaca College's role in preparing students for transfer to the CSU and UC systems.
