

The Water Conservation Garden was recently selected as the recipient of the Rain Bird Corporation's 2007 "Intelligent Use of Water Award." The Garden was selected from a prestigious international slate of candidates to receive the recognition and accompanying \$10,000 prize. Rain Bird Corporation created this award to "honor those persons or organizations whose innovation, leadership, ingenuity and overall commitment to

improved landscape water efficiency has raised the standard for outdoor water conservation." The panel of judges found the Water Conservation Garden's contribution to innovation, water savings, landscape preservation, and overall community impact to be superior.
