## WELCOME ABOARD

#### • APPOINTMENT OF VICE PRESIDENT, STUDENT DEVELOPMENT & SERVICES

Joining Cuyamaca College as Vice President of Student Development & Services is Dr. **Joseph Marron.** Dr. Marron earned an Ed.D. in Higher Education Administration from Vanderbilt University in Nashville, TN; an M.Ed. in Administration and Supervision from Temple University in Philadelphia, PA; and a B.S. degree in Health, Physical Education and Recreation from Lock Haven University in Pennsylvania. Most recently, he completed the Institute for Educational Management at Harvard University.

Dr. Marron served as the Systemwide Director for Educational Leadership at Alliant International University's (AIU) Graduate School of Education. In addition, he has served as both Vice President for Student Services and Enrollment Management; and Program Director/Associate Professor, Educational Leadership and Management Doctoral Program at AIU. Prior to his employment with AIU, he served as Dean of Student Affairs at Lock Haven University in Pennsylvania. Dr. Marron has authored several publications and made numerous presentations in the field of student services. He is a member of several professional associations including the National Association of Student Personnel Administrators, the Association of College Personnel Administrators, and the Association for Student Judicial Affairs. Dr. Marron has received many honors and distinctions throughout his professional career. Currently, he serves on a number of community boards and volunteers his time to support various service organizations.

#### • APPOINTMENT OF EXECUTIVE DEAN, INSTITUTIONAL ADVANCEMENT

Joining Cuyamaca College as Executive Dean of Institutional Advancement is **Mr. Henri Migala.** Mr. Migala earned an M.P.H. in Public Health from the University of North Texas and an M.A. in Anthropology/Sociology from the University of Texas at Arlington.

Mr. Migala served as Director of Health Programs for the International Relief Teams organization in San Diego. He was responsible for new program development, establishing donor relations, fundraising and grant writing, grant administration and management, media relations and the development of partnerships with public and private agencies and community groups. He is an adjunct faculty member in the Anthropology Department at San Diego City College. He volunteers as a clinical faculty member for UCSD Medical School, where he teaches on issues related to international health. Lastly, Mr. Migala is also a faculty lecturer at SDSU's School of Public Health.

In his new role as Executive Dean of Institutional advancement, Mr. Migala will have the responsibility of furthering the institutional advancement of the college through resource development, promoting college and community relations, and providing institutional support services. He will be coordinating the grants program and working with staff and faculty to identify and develop grant resources, in addition to serving as the liaison to the College Foundation, he will be the college's official Public Information Officer. Mr. Migala will also serve as the college's liaison to respective District committees.

#### • RECYCLING – IT'S A GOOD THING!

In response to the passage of AB75, in 2000, Cuyamaca College established the Waste Management Ad Hoc Committee, with a charge to increase recycling efforts. AB75 required each state agency and each large state facility to divert at least 25% of generated solid waste from landfills by 1/1/02, and 50% by 1/1/04. As a result, Cuyamaca College is a 'single stream' facility, a term used to describe the recycling of all paper, cans, glass bottles, plastic and cardboard. Because Cuyamaca College sells its cardboard to Allen Co (a recycler), most of its recycled products are picked up at no cost. The college's yearly report to the State Integrated Waste Management Department indicated that 88.3% of generated solid waste was diverted from the landfills.
