SECOND ANNUAL WOMEN IN TECHNOLOGY CAREER NIGHT

On March 14th, Cuyamaca College and the Women in Technology student club hosted the Second Annual Career Night for young women entitled, "Cutting Edge Careers for Modern Women." The event focused on math, sciences, technology, and trades currently underrepresented by women. Over 250 young women and their parents attended the event, which featured keynote speaker, Bridget Landry, Deputy Systems Uplink Engineer of the Jet Propulsion Lab in Pasadena. Amidst the air of excitement, were 30 display tables, some with intriguing demonstrations. Kudos to Connie Elder, CIS instructor and her team volunteers for a most successful event.

MATH SCIENCE FIELD DAY

On March 11th, Cuyamaca College hosted teams from Francis Parker, La Jolla High, Patrick Henry, Helix High, Canyon Crest, Carlsbad, Escondido, Mira Mesa, Vista, San Diego, and Scripps Ranch High School to participate in the 43rd Annual High School Math Field Day. Over 130 team members participated in the event. A total of 30 medals were awarded to individual students while teams were awarded prizes such as graphing calculators donated by Texas Instruments. • CUYAMACA COLLEGE HONORED FOR COHORT DEFAULT RATE

Cuyamaca College has received a Certificate of Outstanding Achievement for its low student loan default rate. The certificate was presented to the Financial Aid Office by Mary Snyder, a representative of EDFUND. EDFUND cited Cuyamaca College for reducing its student default rate significantly between 2002 and 2003. In 2003 (the last year for which complete figures are available), Cuyamaca's default rate was 7.8%, which compares favorably with the 2003 California community college default rate of 8.07%. Cuyamaca College is one of only two community colleges in San Diego County to receive this accolade.

CONNIE ELDER NOMINATED FOR ATHENA PINNACLE EDUCATOR AWARD

Congratulations to Connie Elder, CIS Instructor, on her second nomination for the prestigious Athena Pinnacle Educator Award. Dr. Marsha Fralick, Counselor, has become a frequent presenter on college success conferences nationwide. Her textbook, *College and Career Success*, is now being used by fifteen colleges in five different states.

CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER NEWS

At the request of the Sycuan Band of the Kumeyaay Nation, Linda Haar presented a follow up in-service training to the staff at the Education Center in January. This training was the second part to a workshop given in August 2005. The topic was "Working Together as a Team and Creating the Ideal Work Environment."

The Child Development Center invited staff from the Sycuan Tribal preschool program to join them for a four-part in-service training presented by the Kids Included Together (KIT) program. This program provides training on concepts and techniques for children with special needs. The first part was presented in February and the remaining training sessions will be held in March, April and May.

On May 22nd, Stephanie Tripp, a part-time instructor in the Paralegal Studies Program, will co-present a course offered by the National Business Institute titled, "Internet Strategies for Legal Professionals."
