## COLLEGE RECEIVES GRANT AWARD FOR GENE SEQUENCING EQUIPMENT

Congratulations are in order to the visionary Science faculty led by Chairperson **Kathryn Nette.** Thanks to their good work and the support of Dr. Madelaine Wolfe, Dean of Instruction for Division I, and Executive Dean Henri Migala, Cuyamaca College has been selected to receive a grant from LI-COR's Genomics Education Matching Funds program in the amount of \$47,601.50 toward the Gene Sequencing and AFLP® Package. This package will enable faculty and students to do innovative research on DNA sequencing, AFLP genotyping on selected organisms for biodiversity and mapping research and studies.

Science and Engineering faculty are to be commended for their commitment to training the next generation of genomics researchers. It is progressive accomplishments such as this that ensures that the college's Science and Engineering Department will continue to provide state-of-the-art instruction well into the future.
