# 1. CUYAMACA COLLEGE'S BOTANICAL SOCIETY AND ORNAMENTAL HORTICULTURE 9<sup>TH</sup> AGGIE OPEN A SUCCESS!

The Cuyamaca College Botanical Society and the Ornamental Horticulture Program hosted its 9<sup>th</sup> Annual Aggie Open Golf Tournament at Bonita Golf Club on October 14th. She will represent California at the 2005 Delegate Assembly at the AMATYC Conference in San Diego this November.
