

# President's Report to the Governing Board November 16, 2004

### 1. Spring Schedule Debut a Resounding Success

The Pacific Coast Conference has selected Cuyamaca soccer player **Sarah Strange** as its Women's Co-Athlete of the Week. Sarah, a freshman midfielder and goalkeeper from Grossmont High School, played 80 minutes in goal last Monday, allowing one goal and making six saves, in a loss to Grossmont. She played 90 minutes in goal Wednesday, allowing one goal and picking up five saves, in a 2-1 victory over Palomar. She scored two goals Thursday playing midfielder for 90 minutes in a 4-0 win over San Diego City College. Sarah concluded the week by playing 45 minutes of shutout soccer, with one save, and 45 minutes at midfield (with a goal and an assist) in a 4-1 win over Southwestern.

#### 6. LOWER DIVISION TRANSFER PROJECT REPRESENTATIVE APPOINTED

Congratulations to **Michael Wangler**, Geography Instructor, on his appointment by the State-wide Academic Senate as the community college discipline representative (for geography) to the CSU Lower Division Transfer Project (LDTP).
