COLLEGE HONORS AND NOTEWORTHY NEWS

GROSSMONT HEALTHCARE DISTRICT GRANT AWARDED TO CUYAMACA COLLEGE

Cuyamaca College's Disabled Students Program and Services (DSP&S) Department received a \$10,000.00 grant from the Grossmont HealthCare District for adapted computer technology. The grant provides funds for: large screen monitors for low-vision students, personal FM loop systems for hearing impaired students, brailing software for the blind, specialized scanners for learning disabled students, one complete computer system for training faculty on assistive technology and web accessibility software. The adapted equipment will facilitate student access, ensure student retention and support academic excellence at Cuyamaca College. Kudos to Beth Viersen for initiating the grant request!

On October 5th, Eric Preibisius, Chair of the mathematics department, was a presenter at the "Strengthening Student Success – What Counts" Conference. Several hundred educators attended the conference which was sponsored by Cal-PASS, the RP Group and CAI (California Assessment Institute). Mr. Preibisius' presentation was on a Basic Algebra Standards Deconstruction Project in which he has been participating with Cal-PASS.
