

The purpose of this supplementary document is to showcase the data that supports the assertions and recommendations captured in the 2020 General Counseling Program Review.


Purpose

The datapoints included illustrate trends in Course Retention Rates, Course Success Rates, Persistence Rates, Semester Units Completed and STEM Student Success Measures. The data offers an equity lens into these factors, and as a result it can be instrumental in institution-wide, student-centric decision-making.


Definition: The Course Retention metric is a measure of the percentage of students who earn a grade of A, B, C, D, F, P, NP or I in coursework. It includes all grades other than W.



This summary chart illustrates the course retention rates among students who received counseling services in Fall 2016, Spring 2017, Fall 2017, Spring 2018, Fall 2018 and Spring 2019. The data shows a breakdown by ethnicity to offer some insights that may drive decision making and policy.





This summary chart illustrates the course retention rates among students who DID NOT receive counseling services in Fall 2016, Spring 2017, Fall 2017, Spring 2018, Fall 2018 and Spring 2019. A comparison with the previous chart highlights a notable increase in course retention when students use counseling services.



This chart shows steady retention rates over time and highlights that counseling has an impact on retention. With counseling, students have an average retention rate of 89.3% versus 84.6% for students not receiving counseling.


Asian students have an overall retention rate of 88.5%. The course retention rate among those who receive counseling averages 92.4% while those not receiving counseling have an average retention rate of 84.5%.






Hispanic students have an overall retention rate of 85.3%. The course retention rate among those who receive counseling averages 88.3% while those not receiving counseling have an average retention rate of 82.3%.


Black Non-Hispanic students have an overall retention rate of 82.5%. The course retention rate among those who receive counseling averages 85.6% while those not receiving counseling have an average retention rate of 79.4%.






White Non-Hispanic students have an overall retention rate of 89.4%. The course retention rate among those who receive counseling averages 91.9% while those not receiving counseling have an average retention rate of 87%.


Students of two or more ethnicities have an overall retention rate of 86.4%. The course retention rate among those who receive counseling averages 89.7% while those not receiving counseling have an average retention rate of 83.1%.




Definition: The Course Success Metric is a measure of the percentage of students who earn a passing grade of A, B, C or P in coursework.





This summary chart illustrates the course success rates among students who DID NOT receive counseling services in Fall 2016, Spring 2017, Fall 2017, Spring 2018, Fall 2018 and Spring 2019. A comparison with the previous chart highlights a notable increase across the board in course success when students use counseling services.



This chart supports the assertion that counseling has a positive impact on course success rates. With counseling, student success averages 78.3% versus 71.7% among students not receiving counseling during this 5-semester period.


Asian students have an overall average success rate of 77.3%. The course success rate among those who receive counseling averages 82.6% while those not receiving counseling have an average success rate of 72.1%.






Hispanic students have an overall average success rate of 69.4%. Those who receive counseling average 73.0% while those not receiving counseling have an average success rate of 65.7%.


Black Non-Hispanic students have an overall average course success rate of 62.9%. Those who receive counseling average 65.3% while those not receiving counseling have an average course success rate lower of 60.5%.






White Non-Hispanic students have an overall average course success rate of 80.2%. Those who receive counseling average 83.2% while those not receiving counseling have an average course success rate lower of 77.3%.


Students of two or more ethnicities have an overall average course success rate of 74.2%. Those who receive counseling average 78.0% while those not receiving counseling have an average course success rate lower of 70.3%.




Definition: The Persistence Metric is a measure of the percentage of students who are enrolled during fall census and spring census in the same academic year (e.g. fall 2018 and spring 2019).



This summary chart illustrates the persistence rates among students who received counseling services in Fall 2016, Spring 2017, Fall 2017, Spring 2018, Fall 2018 and Spring 2019. The data shows a breakdown by ethnicity to offer some insights that may drive decision making and policy.





This summary chart illustrates the persistence rates among students who DID NOT receive counseling services in Fall 2016, Spring 2017, Fall 2017, Spring 2018, Fall 2018 and Spring 2019. A comparison with the previous chart highlights a notable increase across the board in persistence when students use counseling services.



This chart further supports the assertion that counseling has a positive impact. With counseling, student persistence averages 77% versus 48% among students not receiving counseling during this five-semester period.


Asian students have an overall average persistence rate of 64%. The course success rate among those who receive counseling averages 81% while those not receiving counseling have an average persistence rate of 48%.






Hispanic students have an overall average persistence rate of 60%. The course success rate among those who receive counseling averages 76% while those not receiving counseling have an average persistence rate of 43%.


Black Non-Hispanic students have an overall average persistence rate of 54%. The course success rate among those who receive counseling averages 66% while those not receiving counseling have an average persistence rate of 42%.








Definition: The Semester Units Completed measure is the average number of units completed in each semester for which students received grades of A, B, C, D or P.

The data shows a breakdown by ethnicity to offer some insights that may drive decision making and policy.





This summary chart illustrates average semester units completed among students who DID NOT receive counseling services in Fall 2016, Spring 2017, Fall 2017, Spring 2018, Fall 2018 and Spring 2019. A comparison with the previous chart highlights a notable increase across the board in semester units completed when students use counseling services.



This chart highlights the impact of counseling on semester units completed. With counseling, students are completing an average of 7.6 semester units while those not receiving counseling on average complete 6.4 semester units.


Overall, Asian students complete 7.5 units per semester. Among those who receive counseling, the average number of semester units completed is 8.1 while those not receiving counseling complete an average of 6.8 semester units.






Overall, Hispanic students complete 6.1 units per semester. Among those who receive counseling, the average number of semester units completed is 6.8 while those not receiving counseling complete an average of 5.4 semester units.

Overall, Black Non-Hispanic students complete 5.6 units per semester. Among those who receive counseling, the average semester units completed is 6.2 while those not receiving counseling complete an average of 5.0 semester units.







Overall, White Non-Hispanic students complete 7.9 units per semester. Among those who receive counseling, the average semester units completed is 8.5 while those not receiving counseling complete an average of 7.3 semester units.


The Cuyamaca STEM and Counseling departments collaborated to develop a cohort system for the STEM program.
