Spring 2020 Retreat Outcomes Summary:

- On April 17, 2020, a total of 56 individuals participated in the annual Planning and Evaluation Retreat, which was facilitated by the Institutional Effectiveness Council and Institutional Effectiveness, Success, and Equity Office via Zoom
- Participants joined breakout groups to discuss the College's performance related to its four strategic priorities in light of previously-established performance standards and targets
- Participants made recommendations regarding the following:
 - Performance standards
 - Performance targets
 - Activities for the College to prioritize for 2020-21 in areas where the College is <u>not</u> meeting the standard
- The Institutional Effectiveness Council reviewed these recommendations and is now providing the recommendations on each of the above areas
 - Notes from the breakout sessions are linked at the bottom of each strategic priority's KPI summary

In light of the feedback received at the Spring 2020 Planning and Evaluation Retreat and the College's current levels of performance, the Institutional Effectiveness Council recommends the following activities as college-wide priorities for 2020-21 related to each strategic priority (in order of importance within each strategic priority):

- Acceleration
 - Expand focus on equity through intentional cross-departmental coordination, professional development, inquiry, and improvement
- Guided Student Pathways: Career
 - Build certificates that can be achieved fully online
 - Promote career education programs that match the labor market needs for our region
 - Conduct certificate audits
- Guided Student Pathways: Completion
 - Expand early career exploration and planning
 - Expand work-based learning opportunities
 - Expand program maps to include general education recommendations for associate degrees and ensure student access to these maps
- Student Validation and Engagement
 - Expand equity-minded professional development opportunities and emphasize respecting and empowering the whole student

- Expand marketing and promotion of the new Career Center and its services
- Increase the connections between the courses students take and their career goals

• Organizational Health

- Simplify and streamline applications/admissions and registration processes
- Prepare to offer more online courses to meet student demand and environmental requirements
- Optimize course scheduling in collaboration with Grossmont College to meet student needs
