## II. President's Report --

#### A. Announcements

- 1. *Academic Senate Elections* -- Angela Nesta 52 votes were cast. The following were elected as officers:

- 2. *Emeriti Celebration and Reception* -- TODAY, in the Quad, at 4pm following the Senate meeting
- 3. *Voluntary Dues* -- Kim Dudzik A total of \$317 has been collected to date with 17 faculty members contributing.
- 4. *ASCCC* (*aka Statewide Academic Senate*) Kim Dudzik, President-elect of the Academic Senate, will be attending the Spring Plenary on April 20-22.
- B. *Governing Board:* A proposed increase to student health fees will be taken before the Governing Board for approval. It will increase from \$18 to \$20 and help fund services in the Health Centers at each college.

## C. District & College Committee/Council, and Other Institutional Updates

- 1. *East County Education Alliance: Dual Enrollment* –Additional meetings will take place to continue talks regarding the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for Dual Enrollment with the GUHSD. Further updates will be brought to Senate as they develop.
- 2. *Compressed Calendar Task Force* -- The next step will be to send out a preference survey to faculty, staff and students.
- 3. *Institutional Effectiveness Partnership Initiative (IEPI)* --Upcoming visits (likely dates): May 2 and 23 (3/21 visit was cancelled)

Be it resolved that the Academic Senate for Cuyamaca College authorize the Honors Program Task force to create the framework for an Honors Program that will (1) mirror that of Mount San Jacinto College, (2) lead to UCLA TAP Certification, and (3) allow departments to develop specific requirements for their students.
