The ARC (Academic Resource Center) provides group and individual tutoring in a wide variety of academic and vocational subjects. Open lab tutoring is available for BOT, CADD, CIS, CISCO and Graphic Design. There is a book-loan program and a space to work on homework. Pathway Academy students can come here for FREE printing. The STEM Achievement Center provides individual assistance in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics. Students also have access to graphing calculators, textbooks, instructional videos, and computer tutorial programs. STEM Achievement Center provides 36 computers for students to use and printing is available for a minimal cost. The Writing Center provides tutoring in writing,

science writing, and reading. ESL tutoring is provided by appointment only. This Center supports writing needs for all classes. The Writing Center has a computer lab (B-167) available for student use during our hours of operation. In addition, Online Writing




